This seminar provides a forum for works-in-progress that explore topics in Latino/a and Borderlands studies. We seek proposals from individuals for seminar papers that examine the interplay of Latino/a people, communities, and culture in the United States; transnational and comparative borderlands studies; migration studies; Latino/a gender and sexuality; changing urban landscapes as a result of Latino/a settlement; civil rights and social movements; Critical Indigenous Studies; and other related topics.

Seminar sessions are held on select Fridays. In 2023-2024, some meetings will take place online via zoom, while others may meet in-person at the Newberry Library, 60 W. Walton St., Chicago, IL.
